Replacement of the Hut Sir Joseph Hood Memorial Playing Fields Marina Avenue KT3 6NF

The Hut is a small shed like structure that is used for selling drinks and ice creams in the summer holiday period in Sir Joseph Hood Memorial Playing Fields The hut is cramped and lacks appropriate water and drainage facilities to enable it to function as a modern catering outlet.

This proposal is to install a larger structure.

This would enable storage space in the main Pavilion to be released for other uses.

It would also allow for an improved catering offer to be provided.

The requirements are:

- i) a larger hut (which could be part funded by the Friends of Sir Joseph Hood)
- ii) an enlarged concrete foundation
- iii) improved water supply and drainage
